Y13s study periods

We have been impressed with the overall approach of Y13 over the past several weeks whilst they have remained on site during their study periods. This has enabled them to refocus following the summer break and allow us to reconnect with them. We have been seeing lots of positive learning behaviours from the majority so far this term, with many making good progress with UCAS as well.

From Monday 29th September, Y13 will be allowed to sign out once more. We do reserve the right that following teaching staff submitting learning profiles and predicted grades to us, to ask students to take part in a form of supervised private study. For any Y13 student affected by this the 6th Form team will be in touch with parents and carers to share our concern and inform them of next steps.

For Y12 students, we will continue to monitor the transition to 6th Form life. So far progress has been positive and I envisage that the decision to allow them to sign out may come before the end of Term 1 if the positive attitudes we are currently seeing, continue.

Trips process update

We will no longer be using the pink medical form to gather student's medical information and emergency contact details ahead of a school trip.

Parents and Carers must ensure that their child/children's medical information is up to date on the MCAS app. We also need a minimum of two emergency contacts per child, to add another contact follow these steps:

- 1. Log in: to your MCAS account via the app or website
- 2. **Navigate**: to your profile by clicking on My Personal Details
- 3. Select: the option to Add Contact or Add New Parent/Guardian
- 4. Enter: the new parent's details
- 5. Click: Submit Changes to save



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
