Safeguarding Alert

The safeguarding team has been made aware of a safeguarding alert regarding a book series including 'Spy Dogs / Pups' and 'Spy Cats', written by Andrew Cope.

Some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been taken over by another party and now leads to inappropriate pornographic content. The publisher, Puffin, has paused sales and distribution of the books and is working with schools, libraries, and retailers to remove copies from circulation. They have stressed that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.

As a school we have checked that our ILC does <u>not</u> stock the books, and we would advise you to check at home for any copies.

I would like to warmly welcome you to our **St Laurence 6th Form Open Evening**. We are immensely proud of our 6th Form and I look forward to sharing with you the wide range of opportunities available here at St Laurence. The evening will begin with a presentation to outline our offer with speeches from the Headteacher, Head Students and myself.

Following the presentation will be an opportunity to explore the range of courses offered and talk to subject teachers. This will help inform the decisions you make about your post-16 options. Students will also be attending talks on post-16 options during the day

In 2025 we were once again the **highest attaining state secondary** 6th Form in Wiltshire with a staggering **B grade average**. For many years now, we have been rated in the **top 15% of 6**th **Forms nationally**.

Y12 Study Periods

We have been pleased with the overall approach of Y12 over the past several weeks whilst they have remained on site during their study periods. 

The Museum of Bath at Work held its Young Inventor of the Year 2025 award ceremony on Saturday 4th October where Zoe and Benjamin Rees-Roberts were announced as the joint winners for their designs.

Year 7 Ashley House twins, Zoe and Ben, came up with the idea of an 'Automatic Pollinator' – a mechanical butterfly which charges its battery from solar panels on its wings and enables it to pollinate flowers.

They also invented an electromagnetic cold preventer – described by Bath Newseum writer, Richard Wyatt, as "equally impressive ".

Flu Vaccinations - Years 7-11

Your child's flu vaccination is now due. We will be visiting St Laurence School on Friday 7th November and Monday 8th December to administer the nasal spray vaccine.

To give consent for your child to receive the vaccine, please:

- complete the consent form (yes or no) using the following link: www.bswschoolagedimms.co.uk/Forms/Flu
- use the school code: WT137057
- complete your child's consent no later than 48 working hours before your school session to ensure your child receives their vaccination.

Even if your child had the vaccine last year, the type of flu can vary each winter, so it is recommended to have it again this year or they won't be protected.

If you decide you do not want to vaccinate your child against flu, please complete the consent form giving the reason. This will help us plan and improve the service.


